Safeline's Mission

Safeline strives to end physical, emotional and sexual violence against women and children through direct service, education, advocacy and social change.

Safeline's History

Safeline was formed in the early 1980s by a group of women who saw their neighbors and friends experiencing domestic and sexual abuse. At that time there was little support and few options available for victims, especially given the rural nature of Safeline's service area. The group began helping victims escape dangerous situations. Recognizing the importance of immediate access to confidential services, they also started Vermont's first, toll-free hotline for survivors. This crucial service inspired the organization's name: Safeline.

FREE and CONFIDENTIAL Services

Hotline:

Trained advocates provide emotional support, assistance with creating individualized safety plans, resources and referrals, and assistance applying for protection orders 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Advocates Provide:

Legal: Safeline provides legal advocacy services, including referrals, assistance with filling out paper work and accompanying survivors to court and the police station.

Economic Justice: Safeline provides survivors with support in addressing their economic, employment, and housing needs.

Medical: Advocates provide emotional support at the hospital for victims after an assault.

Day Shelter: Safeline has a food pantry, computer/printer access and showering facilities for survivors.

Prevention & Education: Safeline provides prevention-based educational programs for schools, businesses, and community organizations. Safeline also has a resource center that is open to the public, complete with books, DVDs, training curricula and education materials.

What is Domestic Violence?

Domestic violence is a pattern of coercive behavior that is used by one person to gain power and control over another person. Forms of domestic violence may include:

- **Verbal and Emotional Abuse**
- **Economic Control**
- **Isolation**
- **Physical Violence**
- **Intimidation and Threats**

What is Sexual Violence?

Sexual violence is any non-consensual sexual conduct. Forms of sexual violence may include:

- **Incest**
- **Child Sexual Abuse**
- **Rape, including Marital Rape**
- **Sexual Harassment**
- **Sexual Exploitation**

What is Stalking?

Stalking is a course of conduct directed at an individual that would cause a person to feel fear. Forms of stalking may include:

- **Following**
- **Unwanted phone calls, letters, emails and text messaging**
- **Threats of violence**
